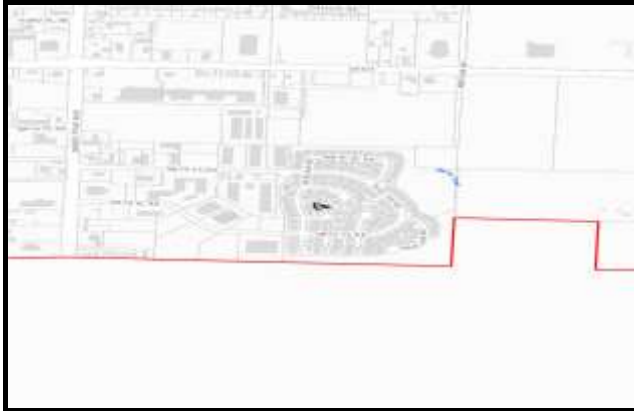


Figure 1. Location Map.

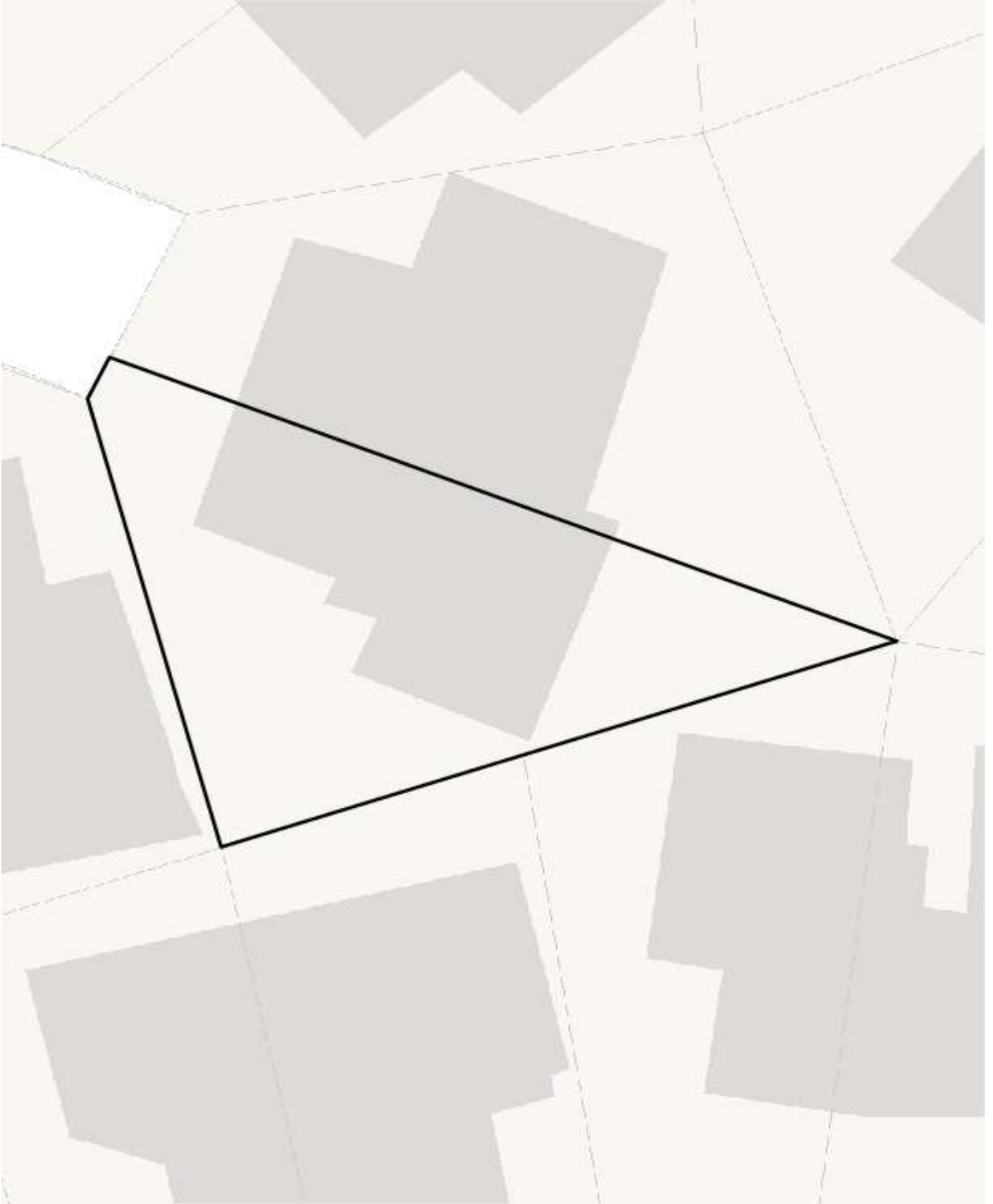
